The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of IQAC

2010-11

Part A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards Quality enhancement and outcome achieved by the end of the year:

2010-2011 academic year started with a number of new developments.

University of Mumbai decided to introduce credit based assessment system from the academic year 2011-12 which needed planned preparations.

Our management resolved to enhance infrastructural facilities of the institution, which had become our urgent need with the vertical and horizontal growth. An additional area of around 11625 Sq. Ft. was made available to us.

IQAC, in its 5th year had new responsibilities to look forward to. It was suggested by UGC that Performance Based Appraisal of faculty at each stage of their promotion should be scrutinized/ monitored by IQAC.

In this connection IQAC coordinator made a presentation on 9th October 2010, detailing CAS (career advancement scheme advocated by U.G.C.) ,for the benefit of academic staff of the college. Subsequently a sub committee consisting of principal, vice principal, several members of IQAC and QAC members, was formed to discuss and chalk out a transparent system to scrutinize PBA pro forma (performance based appraisal pro forma) . A series of meetings were held by this committee in the last week of February 2011. Several points

were discussed at length and decisions were taken. Clear cut directives from the University are still awaited, in this regard.

In the first meeting of IQAC, held in the month of August 2011, Department of Computer Science was congratulated profusely for bagging the first two top ranks in the merit list of B.Sc. (Computer Science) examination Mumbai University, 2010-2011.

In the meeting it was decided that:

- Each quality circle formed under the aegis of IQAC would work throughout the year independently as decided in earlier years, If there is a need, other members of IQAC would pitch in their support for the activities of these circles.
- Chronic attendance defaulters to be monitored and counseled by the class coordinators.

It was proposed that a research project could be taken up to study the ‘impact of regular attendance’ on the holistic growth of students

- “Earn while you learn” program to be strengthened A committee was formed to look after this issue
- A soft folder for each faculty member, containing his/her updated profile to be maintained.
- Special remedial program for those students who attend the lectures regularly (above 90% attendance) but need additional coaching would be organized.
- Latest AQAR to be uploaded on college website.

Following are the achievements of some of the quality circles.

This year **Infra circle** had a massive task of looking into the needs of students, faculty members, departments, administrative office and judiciously distribute the extra space obtained to all these requirements. This was a marathon task on which the members of infra circle worked incessantly, in spite of their busy schedules of lectures/assessment work etc,. By the end of December 2010 and beginning of January 2011, a tentative plan was ready and the work of reconstruction and modification started. Several times the plan was

re modified to accommodate the needs of the various departments and office .The work continued in the summer months of April, May and by the time new academic year started, the additional wings were ready for use. This has resulted in additional lecture rooms, Math lab, media lab, new administrative office, counseling cell, placement cell, language lab etc. for the college. The faculty members as well as students are utilizing the extra space for academic /co-curricular/ extra curricular activities. For this we at VES college are extremely thankful to our management, which has provided us with extra space to the tune of 11625 square feet, in spite of the perennial space crunch of Mumbai city.(details given in the pages 34 under question 25.

Research circle reconstituted itself in the month of December 2010. The objective of the circle is to build an enquiry based approach and research acumen among students and teachers. The circle organized a Research Methodology workshop with the contents spread over nine modules. (details on pg no. 9)

The Circle also plans to bring out a consolidated volume of the published research papers, articles and abstracts by the teachers of our college. This will help not only in consolidating the research output of our faculty members at one place but will also generate a readily available research material for referencing and planning future research.

FIP circle organized several programs under staff development activities.

- On 6th March 2010, there was a staff Development Programme on “Work-Life Balance: Personal and Professional Issues” by Prof. Uday Acharaya.
- On 8th March 2010, under the staff Development Programme Mrs. Aarohi Parimu Khar made a Presentation on “Empowerment of Sexually Abused Women”.
- On 8th March, under the staff Development Programme Dr. Anita Kanwar made a presentation on the “Format of a Research Proposal and Funding Agencies”.
- On 9th March 2010, under the staff Development programme, Dr.(Ms.) Viney Kirpal made a presentation on “Interpersonal Relationships and Team Building”.

The **Additional Credit Program**, which was launched by IQAC in the year 2007 for advanced learners of the college, is steadily getting internalized in the system, albeit with some hiccups. This academic year it started on April 10th with a batch of about 20 students.

The language circle organized the program 'Towards Better Communication in English language' with the objective of helping the students coming from vernacular medium schools. The classes were held in the month of September and March-April just after the terms and exams. The program was sponsored by the UGC fund.

The Alum circle has successfully formulated and established VES ALUMNI ASSOCIATION. The association met on 2nd October 2010 for an inaugural get together and decided that every year on this very day the entire association will meet for tete -a-tete. and discuss its activities for the year. subsequently the association sponsored prizes for the inter collegiate economics conference held on 17th December 2010.

The year end meeting of IQAC was conducted this academic year in the form of a convention of the Q.C's formed under the aegis of IQAC on 30th April at 11 A.M. Each QC in-charge briefed about their activities, achievements of the year 2010-2011. They also discussed the road blocks faced by them.

The academic year 2010-2011 ended with a happy note.

CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL YOUTH DAY.

The National Youth day marks the birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda .The college celebrated Swami Vivekananda's 148th birth anniversary on 12th January 2011.The days function focused on imbibing Swami Vivekananda's ideals among the present day youth.

The program commenced with a prayer song sung by Swami Sarvagananda of Ramakrishna Mission. It was followed by Principal's inspiring address, about teachings of Swami Vivekananda and significance of his ideals in character building among youth.

Dr. Suniti Nagpurkar, Head of Economics Department, elucidated on three aspects of the Swami Vivekananda's message to the youth; **thought, goal and responsibility**.

Three students of T.Y.B.A. (Psychology) – Krishna Thaker, Swati Thaker and Dimpy Shukla guided by Prof. Radhika Mathur gave a power-point presentation on empowering youth. The highlight of the presentation was on being clear about one's goal in life and facing challenges without getting discouraged.

Meenakshi of T.Y.B.Sc., recited some poems from Swamiji's free translation of verses from Bhatrihari's Sanskrit poem 'Vairagya Satakam'. The program culminated with a very powerful speech on Swami Vivekananda's life by a student. An exhibition, of books written by Swamiji himself and other books on his life and teachings, was organized by our library.

A large number of students from different faculties attended the program.

Career Fair-cum-Fest called "**KALARATNA – KARMA**" was hosted by the Career Guidance and Placement Cell in the month of January.

Hosted on 28th and 29th of January this year, the two day festival "**KALARATNA – KARMA**" encompassed orientation seminars on various careers, one to one counseling sessions by various departments and over 70 exhibits both for the in-house students and for those from outside. Counselor Ms. Meenakshi Khanolkar and Mrs. Kiran Dhall, the Head of Vivekanand Education Society's Vocational Guidance Centre also made valuable contributions for the career exhibition.

Research Methodology workshop

“You can’t stop the idea whose time has come” was the experience of the Research Circle in organizing this 36-hour workshop on Research Methodology with its contents spread over nine modules. The workshop addressed FAQs regarding

- academic research,
- statistical tools used in social science research,
- modes and forms of research communication and
- hands-on training for the software package “R” popularly used in Social Science research.

The faculty was selected from the University departments, renowned professional and management institutes and other research organizations. The response of the participants was overwhelming. The workshop was organized primarily for the faculty members of our college, though some delegates from other colleges also attended it. As the workshop was planned at a very short notice, many of our colleagues who were not members of the circle voluntarily came forward to help. Twenty one faculty members attended the workshop.

Self Empowerment programme

CWDC organized Self Defense and Self Empowerment programme for the girl students in the college. The programme took off very well this academic year. It is a 16-hour programme that includes techniques of stress management, self defense and the knowledge of physiology, hygiene and basic legal literacy in the event of difficulties.

The Times of India, Chembur - Ghatkopar Plus edition applauded this initiative and the successful response it generated among students.

Might of Mathematics.

“Pen is mightier than sword and Mathematics is mightier than many weapons of the modern day world”. To showcase the might of this fundamental subject, the Department of Mathematics, in association with Homi Bhabha Centre For Science Education(HBCSE), organized the conference “Mathemight-5” on 19th January, 2011. The conference with the theme “Surprises in Mathematics and their Application.” included events like Paper Presentation by under grad Students, expository Poster Presentation on the same theme, Mathematical Treasure Hunt and a lecture by an eminent Mathematician.

Students from various Mumbai colleges such as St Xaviers from South Mumbai ,CKT College from Panvel , SIES from central Mumbai, Ratnam ,Royal and CHM college from different suburbs of Mumbai participated in the conference.

The inaugural session started at 9.45 A.M .The highlight of the inaugural session was a talk titled “Life of Pi” by Dr.R.Ragunathan , a Mathematician from IIT Bombay. While he discussed the problem of “squaring a circle” in absolute Mathematical terms, his talk was intertwined with many historical anecdotes about great Mathematicians, which kept the audience spellbound. He went on to explain that **Squaring the circle** is a problem proposed by ancient geometers and it took about 2000 years for mathematicians over the globe to conclude in definite terms that this task was impossible! The solution, finally, was a consequence of Lindemann Weierstrass theorem proved in mid-1800’s .This theorem essentially proves that Pi is a transcendental number. One of the many anecdotes mentioned in course of this talk was about the great mathematician Archimedean. When Syracuse was attacked by the mighty Roman emperor, the king of Syracuse approached Archimedes to save the situation. Archimedes, the genius that he was, designed machines capable of lifting the attacking ships out of the water and setting ships on fire using an array of mirrors! This interesting session was concluded with Dr. Aloka Kanhare of HBCSE elucidating the prospects of higher education in mathematical sciences in general.

The second session of the conference saw the students from various colleges presenting Papers on variety of concepts in Mathematics, the ‘eureka’ element of the concept and its application. The topics ranged from Cryptography , Probability to Golden Number and Magic Squares. Another highlight of this session was expository posters presented on the same theme. The topics ranged from fractals to game theory.

The Mathematical Treasure-Hunt generated tremendous interest, adding a fun flavour to the conference The students of Math organized the treasure hunt competition which involved figuring out Mathematical clues to get to the treasure. Participants in the hunt thoroughly enjoyed themselves and the organisers also had a field day conducting the event. Finally, the scavengers from CHM college found the treasure!

At the end of the paper presentation event which lasted for almost 6 hours, eminent Mathematician Dr.Prof.Sane (from IIT B),well known for his insight into the subject among students and teachers of Math in Mumbai university, gave his valuable and lucid comments on each presentation .This in itself was a reward for the participating students. Prizes were distributed.The program culminated with valedictory session with encouraging words from the principal Dr.J.K Phadnis . It was truly heartening to see the students enjoying the process of deep logical thinking , in today’s era of quick gratification.

Part - B

1. Activities reflecting goals and objectives of institution.

The mission of our institution is 'pursuit of excellence in higher education'. The goals leading to this mission, are to provide diverse learning opportunities to students for acquiring deep knowledge in their subjects of interest along with an all-round personality development

This is reflected in the curriculum design, extra curricular and co curricular activities of our institution. (Details of these are given under corresponding questions). In spite of the fact that a large number of our students are first generation learners, we are continuously striving to enlighten our students in their chosen fields as well as in life skills. The objectives of our institution and the activities undertaken to achieve these, in the year 2010-11 are as follows :

To provide conducive academic atmosphere to students (objective1).

In our continuous effort to provide our students conducive atmosphere in the college we have adopted following measures

- Our students are encouraged to interact within classroom via seminars, presentations, case studies, games etc.
- In our endeavor to encourage students to think independently, various departments organized group discussions in the classrooms, where in students are expected to state their views and opinions freely. Students are encouraged to contest diverse views.
- In order to encourage motivated students various departments devised their own methods to facilitate their spirit of enquiry.(ref. best practices mentioned in earlier AQAR).
- Department of Computer Science /I.T. organized lectures, /workshops

by industry experts, to update their students on various advanced techniques in the field. Our alumni from the same fields were invited to discuss the challenges in the ever changing world of IT

- Departments of Economics and Commerce made extra efforts to identify the students who can be groomed as effective communicators and encouraged them to understand technical, social complexities through additional reading, discussions and participation in zonal level elocution and essay writing competitions.

i) To improve over all academic performance of students.(objective 2)

- Regular class tests / tutorials were conducted to give sufficient practice.
- In some descriptive subjects, test series were conducted throughout the year. The students were given feedback, after each test, and specific guidelines for presentation of answers in the examination.
- The teachers of our institution continuously look for new ways to make the teaching interesting and learner centric, for example use of *Mind mapping* technique in Math class, peer to peer learning method in large classes, use of live projects and experiential learning in BMS department.
- Remedial courses/bridge assignments were provided to weak or backward students in subjects like Mathematics, Economics, Commerce, Physics and English language
- OHP / LCD were used in class room teachings to facilitate understanding of difficult topics.
- Computer simulations were used to depict some scientific themes in Physics department. Also use of technology such as laser beam facilitated better understanding through visualization of some concepts of Optics in Physics.

iii) **To inculcate discipline as a value among the students.** (Objective 3.)

- We emphasize on keeping our premises clean.
- The annual media festival Impressions started off with “CLEANLINESS **DRIVE**” on January 12, 2011.
- Our college is well known for strict adherence to norm of regular attendance in class. Attendance committee sees to it that defaulters in this respect be warned and counseled till they show improvement in their attendance.
- We emphasize on punctuality in class rooms.
- We emphasized on adherence to certain dress code by students and teachers

iv) **To develop employable skills among students (4th objective):**

We believe that academic achievements need to be complemented with certain skills which will improve their employability status, and to achieve this, the students must go beyond classroom learning and exam oriented learning. They must acquire general knowledge, communication skills, quantitative skills, & outside exposure. Following are some of the activities taken up with this target:

- Various departments conducted class wise elocution competitions, quiz competitions & seminar competitions.
- Career Guidance Cell organized interview (Mock) and Group Discussion to prepare for various entrance tests for various professional courses and careers.
- Career Guidance Cell worked through out the year to improve Vocabulary & retention skills of our students to prepare them for competitive exam.
- Students were encouraged, trained and supported to participate in University Youth Festival and inter- collegiate competitions. (Award List follows the question number).
- Students were encouraged to participate in M³ contest (Maths, Muscle Man contest), to improve their quantitative ability.
- Educational visits, field trips, guest lecturers were organized by different departments to provide students with relevant exposure.

- Departments of Microbiology, BMS, and Physics & BMM encouraged students to gain practical knowledge during their vacation by undertaking summer training.
- BMS section organized two-day program called 'Brand Wagon' & 'Confluence' wherein students were exposed to talks, lectures from practicing experts from the relevant field. This also exposed students to business situations, case studies etc which help them in turn to apply theory in practice.
- BMM section organized the annual event 'Impressions' and gave students experience and exposure to media management, documentary making & film appreciation.
- Experts from Industry on several occasions are invited to appraise our students about industry expectations.

v) To render service to the society. (Objective 5.)

- The foremost service to the society, we feel, is to make our students good human beings, concerned and honest citizens – for they are the future of our nation. We therefore continuously strive to achieve this.
- Students in large number participated in Social work programs. For this the platforms provided are N. S. S., **Out Reach** (initiated in the academic year 2010-11) and ACP (Details will be found from response to Q. 16).
- Department of BMM organizes SAW (Social Awareness Week), to bring awareness about various issues of concern for our nation.

The theme of the annual event 'Confluence' of department of BMS this year was 'green' i.e. to motivate the youth to help stop the abuse of environment and protect Earth.

2. New Academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

3. Innovation in Curriculum design and Transaction.

Syllabus of each UG and PG program under Mumbai University is provided by the board of study of the respective subject, along with the time line.

To transact the prescribed syllabus, each department of V.E.S. College designs a curriculum, suitable for the target group of students, at the beginning of the academic terms.

The main aim of the curriculum design is to facilitate the student's progress towards mastery of the knowledge and skills needed to complete the course. In order to achieve an all-round personality development of students, the curriculum transaction is done in such a way that it demands active participation and involvement of students

Following are some of the measures adopted by various departments of the college as a part of the curriculum design

i. Seminars / Presentations/workshops:

These methods of enhancing interest amongst students is internalized by many departments of our college.

- A workshop on “Basics of Bioinformatics and Hands-on session on Structural Bioinformatics” was organized for the students of TYBSc. Microbiology from 19th July to 24th July 2010.
- On 19th, 20th and 21st of October 2010, SYCS student Abdus Khatri conducted a session on Flash and Photoshop.
- On 25th Sept '10, Mr. Harsh Damania of TYCS class conducted a seminar for SYCS class on SQL in Oracle.
- Physics department organized **a refresher course** in Electrodynamics and Mathematical Methods for S.Y.B.Sc. (Physics) students. The objective was to strengthen the conceptual understanding through problem solving
- On 6th Sept '10, students of SYBSc Comp Science conducted a hardware workshop for the students of FYBSc Comp Science.

List of such activities in the college continues incessantly.

ii. Other than class-room study:

Experiential Learning, Live projects, Computer Assisted Learning/teaching, Case-study method, Special problem solving sessions, group discussions are some of the methods adopted to transact the curriculum in various departments. Some times the students learn by skit presentation also. The S.Y.B.Sc. (Micro & B.T.) students presented a skit titled ‘Lage Raho Colibhai’ The skit which depicts the disparity between bacteria cultivated in laboratory and those found in nature, was appreciated by students of Microbiology as well as students of other departments

iii. Outdoor excursion / Field Trips –

To bridge the gap between theory and practical students of some of the department are taken for Industrial visits and study tours.

iv. Book Display

Specially selected books were displayed on different days in the central library, by the department of Environmental studies, for students of B.Com and BMS. This was done to increase awareness and interest in the subject by some departments. The purpose was to promote self learning and to inculcate the habit of reference reading among students. Books related to important issues like global warming, rain water harvesting, disaster management were put up on display.

v. Notice Board Study concept was introduced as a curriculum design to familiarize the students with the various recent happenings in their subject of interest. Articles, charts, current news paper clippings were displayed on different notice boards, which in turn helped students to relate their class room learning to real world.

vi. Developing teaching learning tools with students participation:

Use of OHP/LCD : Almost all departments use OHP /LCD to give Visual effect to teaching and to conveniently handle large data and proofs.

vii. Exhibition:

- Students of S.Y.B.Sc. ,Mathematics, were encouraged to make **mind maps** to depict the sequence of abstract ideas leading to a major mathematical concept.
- As has become an annual practice, the Department of sociology puts up an exhibition on current social issues mirroring ground realities of today's world. This gives the students a deeper insight into the topics, which they Study as a part of the prescribed syllabus.
- Students of Economics department put up a permanent display of charts on certain important data in the T.Y. B.A lecture room, which acts as a 'ready-information' and also highlights interrelation between different papers they study. From time to time new inputs are made in this display.

viii. Discuss Case Studies:

This has become part of course curriculum transacted in several subjects. It makes the concept being studied more real and relevant.

- Department of Computer Sc., to understand the process of project development.
- Department of Commerce to highlight industrial management and various developments in different industries and Commerce.
- Department of Economics to understand the applicability and relevance of various economic concepts.
- Department of Psychology to understand the intricacies of human relations.

ix. Special assignment as bridge course:

To bridge the gap felt by students in the transition from + 2 level to first year graduation level following departments designed bridge program and assignment sets

- Department of Economics
- Department of Physics (ref best practice–AQAR 2009-10)

x. Peer to peer learning –

Departments of Environmental Studies, Mathematics and Economics used ‘Peer to Peer’ Method to teach certain difficult concepts to a large group of students.

xi. Subject Association activities -

Exhibitions, festivals, seminars, workshops, Quiz, Screening of educational films, essay competitions, logo competitions were organized regularly during the weekly Forum Time on Saturdays by various subject Associations of our college.

xii. Making documentaries, docudramas, ad films:

These were some practices adopted by the department of B.M.M. of our institution to initiate the students to the world of media.

xiii. Newsletter Publication, Photography:

The in-house publication of the department of BMM was released during the department’s annual inter-collegiate festival – IMPRESSIONS’008. The theme of the 18- page GOONJ this year was ‘Freedom’.

4. Inter - disciplinary programmes started: -

None in the year 2010-11

5. Examination reforms implemented:

In the year 2009-2010 we adopted the following measures suggested by the examination committee of the college

- page numbers were printed in the answersheet.
- Stitched answer sheets were supplied to the examinees
- More number of pages were included in the answer sheets.

These measures successfully reduced the number of cases where students used unfair practices like smuggling in supplements during the examination. We therefore continued these practices.

Other than university examination, every department conducts periodic tests in their respective subjects for each class by way of **open book test, test series, objective test** etc. to improve the general performance of the students.

6. No. of candidates qualified for NET / SET :-

None in the year 2010-2011 from among faculty members.

It may be noted that almost all of our permanent faculty members who have joined the institution after 1991 are NET /SET qualified.

17. Community Service:

The National service scheme unit of our college provides a platform for the interested students to understand the social issues in its true perspectives and contributing towards social causes and the unit has created indelible foot prints by organizing various socially relevant programs and activities.

Following are highlights of the community services rendered by the group in the year 2009-210:

Enrolment drive and Orientation Program: Enrolment drive was conducted in the month of July and 111 boys and 89 girls were admitted for the program. In order to orient the newcomers, an orientation cum training program was conducted on 14th July, 2010 in college by NSS PO's.

Fund collection Drive: A fund collection drive was organized and Rs.1,500 was collected for the Hi-Tech Foundation, and NGO for the cause of physically challenged children. The unit set up a sale counter in the campus on 14th August as a part of Independence Day celebrations through which they sold national flags prepared by physically challenged children.

Thalassaemia awareness and detection program in the campus: The unit, in association with Rotary Club of Chembur and Faith Foundation, conducted a Thalassaemia awareness program and detection camp in the campus. Mr. Vinay Shetty of Faith Foundation created awareness through an intensive class room contact program on 22th July. Blood samples were collected from 368 students who were given clinical reports with necessary suggestions for further perusal of the case.

Blood Donation Camp: The unit organized two blood donation camps on 24th July in morning and afternoon sessions; it collected total 160 bottles in association with S.L.Raheja Hospital, Mahim and ESIS.

Blood donors club: Ever since the inception of the unit we have established a blood donors club in our college to provide blood on the spot to the needy emergency patients admitted in various hospitals. This year our volunteers could help 15 needy patients in various hospitals.

AIDS awareness program: AIDS awareness program in the campus, adopted village and slum area were also organized by the unit throughout the academic year. The volunteers organized an exhibition on AIDS awareness using materials supplied by Mumbai AIDS Control Society and those prepared by the volunteers during our AIDS awareness campaign. The exhibition was held in the campus on 26th December, 2010.

Participation in seminars and training programs: Three volunteers attended a leadership training camp organized by University of Mumbai at Don Bosco School, Karjat. Our volunteers also attended AIDS awareness seminars and workshops conducted by various colleges and NGO's.

Malaria Awareness Program: As instructed by the university NSS cell, we have established a disaster management cell in our college involving 30 NSS Volunteers as core volunteers. Our disaster management cell was very active throughout the year conducting various awareness programs on the theme of disaster management the campus as well as in our adopted slum pockets and our adopted village Sutraksar.

Rural Camp: As usual a rural residential camp was organized at our adopted village Sutrakar from 24th December, 2010 to 30th December, 2010. The theme of the camp was "Youth for Healthy India." The campers undertook various innovative programmes such as Water conservation, energy conservation, health and hygiene etc. An environment awareness rally was conducted in the village involving local primary school children. The volunteers also constructed a two small bandaras. Sports meet for locals, adivasi dance competition and cultural programs were also organized by the volunteers during their seven day stay in the village.

In addition:

Extending our support to various social causes, is something, we believe in, as an institution. This culture we try to inculcate among our students in various ways. Some such activities undertaken by our students are listed below:

- This academic year College has initiated a cell called OUTREACH which provides a platform to motivated students to actively participate in social work. The students of the cell worked for the underprivileged, in various organizations This we felt is a great learning in itself.
- As part of outreach activity with the OUTREACH Cell, the TYBA students of Psychology visited children at “Umang”-a home for the mentally challenged run by Worldwide Children Trust. They expressed their sensitivity to the underprivileged and volunteered to celebrate birthday of one of the children at Umang.
- TYBA students of Psychology department conducted an awareness program on mental health at Raghuleela mall on 10th October 2010, to commemorate ‘World Mental Health Day’ declared by WHO.

20. Improvements in the library services:

- 1. Renewal of Membership to BCL:** Membership of the BCL was renewed after a gap of 2 years after the decision was made in the Library committee meeting. BCL will now not be available physically for browsing, but books can be ordered online.
- 2. E- Resource Centre:** Scanning Facility started for the students in the E-Resource centre.
- 3. The Library has renewed the membership of INFLIBNET of the N-LIST.** It offers access of **200 plus e-journals**. We have linked the same for the college website also for the convenience of the faculty members. This is one of the most remarkable feature added to the library collection this year.
- 4. Institutional Repository:** An Institutional Repository of Faculty Publications and Institute's Publication was set up in this academic Year 2010-2011 using the open source software D-Space. The same will be linked from the Website

in the next academic year after the data is completely added to the D-Space Repository.

- A Software “Path Infotech Solutions” is being used for filing Electronic Quarterly Returns i.e. eTDS.

25. Increase in the infrastructural facilities:

Building Infrastructure Enhancement :-

- The academic year 2010-11 brought in a wind fall in terms of space for our college. The engineering college run by our management shifted to a new campus in the month of December 2010 and as a consequence additional area of around 11625 square feet was made available to us by our ever supportive management. The additional space enabled more flexibility to conduct various academic and co-curricular/extra-curricular activities.

This additional space provided additional lecture rooms, two audio visual rooms, a math lab, a language lab, placement cell, sports cabin music club, sick bay, counseling cell and dedicated space for each department. Infra circle worked relentlessly to cater to the space related needs of every department

- The principal’s room was redesigned and a board room has been added to the office of the principal.
- The administrative office has shifted to a spacious hall and is completely redesigned to house the offices of both the aided as well as the non-aided sections. It is also very well equipped. This redesigning of the office has facilitated the convenience of both, the students and the staff members. The number of counters for different needs and requirements of the students have been increased, facilitating quick dissipation of work like issuing of various forms and cards, payment of fees, etc. It also accommodates examination room and storage for stationery.

The staff-room for the faculty members has been expanded to almost double the earlier size and it is now fully air conditioned.

Vivekanand's Career Guidance Cell has extended its services to students as well as to outsiders for almost thirteen years. Having benefited from Career Counseling, several students have thanked the college in their own ways from time to time.

Cell began afresh in 2010 – 2011 with career profiling of every Arts and Commerce student at the first year level saving almost over 400 files in its closet.

At ground zero level the act involved deliberations by students themselves on their careers in light of their abilities and aspirations.

The students were assigned small academic tasks in order to prove their mettle for their choices. The Career Guidance and Placement Cell actually plans to catch these students when they are young and help them grow into their vocations.

This academic year had its usual routine of career talks in various sectors like Aviation Industry, Service Sectors, Hospitality Industry, Higher Education Opportunities and on Preparation for Competitive Exams

But the highlight of this year was an entire Career Fair-cum-Fest called “KALARATNA – KARMA” that was **hosted by the Career Guidance and**

Placement Cell. Hosted on 28th and 29th of January this year, the two day festival “KALARATNA – KARMA” encompassed:

Our college has continued to strive for enhancement of Quality in every aspect in the year 2010-11 and will continue to do so in the years to come.

Following are some of the plans of the institution proposed for the **next academic year**.

Value Addition Programmes:-

- The Departments of Economics and Physics of our college have planned UGC sponsored seminars at state -level in their respective subject fields. In this connection the departments have put forward the applications to UGC office.
- An intercollegiate workshop was planned for the year 2011-12 titled “Advances in Rapid Microbiology and Food Safety” with Shah Brothers Mumbai for Postgraduate students of biological sciences from Mumbai University colleges. The workshop consisted of lectures by Professional from Shah Brothers followed by hand-on training session on latest technique in food analysis (already conducted).
- A workshop on Bio-Informatics was planned for the year 2011-12 (Already conducted) .
- A ten days certification course titled “Capital Markets” is planned jointly by departments of BMS,B.Com (B & I) & B.Com(F.M.). This will be conducted by Interconnected Stock Exchange (going on at present).
- Department of computer science has plans to introduced M.Sc. in Computer Science affiliated to Mumbai University.

Infrastructural extension

- Additional Computer Laboratories are on the cards .These will ease the pressure on existing labs as well as facilitate ‘hands on training’ for the students. It will also provide an opportunity for economically backward students of other departments to get familiarity with basic computer usage.
